Notes from Tim

Softly and Tenderly Jesus Is Calling

Softly and tenderly Jesus is calling, calling for you and for me; see, on the portals he's waiting and watching, watching for you and for me.

Come home, come home; you who are weary, come home; earnestly, tenderly, Jesus is calling, calling, O sinner, come home!

Will Lamartine Thompson (1847-1909) was born in Pennsylvania and died in New York City. He attended Mount Union College in Alliance, Ohio, and the New England Conservatory of Music in Boston, before continuing his musical studies in Leipzig, Germany.

In addition to being a composer of secular, patriotic and gospel songs, Thompson was a music publisher. When his songs were rejected by publishers of his day, he formed his own enterprise, Will L. Thompson & Company, with offices in Chicago and East Liverpool, Ohio. By the 1880s the company expanded beyond publishing music and sold pianos, organs and other instruments and supplies.

The words and music for "Softly and Tenderly Jesus Is Calling" first appeared in a collection compiled for Thompson's company in 1880 by singing-school teacher J. Calvin Bushey. An attribute contributes to the continuing popularity of this genre of religious song that presents Jesus as waiting, caring, and forgiving in intimate—and for many, compelling—metaphors." Perhaps Revelation 3:20 captures the spirit of the hymn: "Behold, I stand at the door, and knock: if any man hear my voice, and open the door, I will come in to him, and will sup with him, and he with me." (KJV) This patient Jesus stands "on the portals . . . waiting and watching . . . for you and for me."

The second stanza takes a different approach: How can we reject the "pleading" one who offers "pardon"? The third stanza increases in urgency: "Time is now fleeting, the moments are passing... shadows are gathering, deathbeds are coming..." The final stanza returns to the theme of Jesus who offers "mercy and pardon" for the sinner.

The genius of a gospel song is usually found in the refrain and this one is no exception. The refrain extends the invitation to "come home" four times in the melody, and an additional two times in the accompanying lower voices.

Interestingly, though "Softly and Tenderly" is the quintessential invitation hymn in the revival tradition, the invitation to "come home" may also be seen as the invitation to join Jesus in heaven.

Dwight L. Moody, near the time of his death took Mr. Thompson by the hand and said, "Will, I would rather have written *Softly and Tenderly Jesus Is Calling* than anything I have been able to do in my whole life.."



THE SHEPHERD'S LOVE



Twenty years ago I went through a very difficult period in my life. I've had several of those times, as most of us do periodically. But that time was especially tough and my heart was breaking for one of my young adult children. I found it difficult to sleep at night, which is something I had never experienced before. I had read some tips on preparing the mind to rest and decided to try one of them. The suggestion was that you close your eyes and imagine yourself somewhere beautiful and serene. Since childhood, I had always loved the mountains, so my peaceful place was a cabin in the woods, surrounded by flowering trees. I would climb in bed at night and in those first quiet moments my husband



would ask, "Are you in the cabin in the woods?" And yes. I was. Sometimes late at night, when I was having an anxious moment because our son had missed yet another curfew, I would say to my husband, "I just want to be in the cabin in the woods." And he knew exactly what I meant. There came a day that our son left home entirely. He went out into the world and chose to stay in it. I was grieved and heavy-hearted for a long, long time. It became harder to find respite in that cabin in the woods. The cabin in the woods was no longer enough. One night as I was praying, God spoke to me. I didn't hear God's audible voice, but I heard him just the same. He reminded me that my son didn't belong to me. My son belonged to him. He gave me permission to let go. He said, "Just as you are my little sheep, he is my little sheep. You must let him go because you are not the Shepherd. I am the Shepherd. Those who stay close to me find rest." That night, I closed my eyes to sleep. But instead of being in the cabin, I saw that I was outside of it. There in a soft grassy area, Jesus the Shepherd was seated. I was there with Jesus, as was my husband and our other children. We were there together, sleeping under His care. I looked out and saw our wayward son. He was off in the distance but he was there. I knew that Jesus saw him and I knew He would handle things. Because that's what our Shepherd does. He handles his flock as only He can. Knowing that the Shepherd was there allowed me to sleep that night. And it's allowed me to sleep so many nights since. There is no peace without the Shepherd. And those who stay close to Him always find rest. "My sheep listen to my voice; I know them, and they follow me. I give them eternal life, and they will never perish; no one can snatch them out of my hand. My Father, who has given them to me, is greater than all; no one can snatch them out of my Father's hand. I and the Father are one.". John 10:27-29.
