

Notes from Tim

Hymn Story--For the Beauty of the Earth

For the beauty of the earth, for the beauty of the skies, for the love which from our birth over and around us lies, Christ our God, to thee we raise this our sacrifice of praise.

Folliott Sandford Pierpoint was born in Bath, England in 1835. After being educated at Queens College in Cambridge, he taught at Somersetshire College. He contributed hymns to various publications and published at least two song books.

He wrote numerous poems, but *For the Beauty of the Earth* is the only one he is remembered for today. The hymn was originally written as a Eucharistic hymn. The Eucharist is what we refer to as The Lord's Supper or Holy Communion.

The phrase, "Christ our God to thee we raise, This our sacrifice of praise," reflected the idea of sacrifice in the communion service. Those words were later changed to "Lord of all, to thee we raise, This our hymn of grateful praise."

He was twenty-nine when he wrote *For the Beauty of the Earth*. The song was inspired by the beauty of the countryside that surrounded him. Pierpoint wrote praises of God for these blessings and wonders all around him into the lyrics. Take for instance the beauty of the earth and sky, beauty of each hour, and the joy of human love ~ brother, sister, parent, child, friends on earth and friends above, for all gentle thoughts and mild, that he incorporates into the lyrics.

The original poem contained eight stanza's at four lines each. Usually four to six stanza's are published in most current denominational hymnals. The last two stanzas are especially meaningful for expressing our devoted and personal faith:

For thy church, that evermore lifteth holy hands above, offering up on every shore her pure sacrifice of love; Lord of all, to thee we raise this our hymn of grateful praise.

For thyself, best Gift Divine, to the world so freely given, for that great, great love of thine, peace on earth, and joy in heaven: Lord of all, to thee we raise this our hymn of grateful praise.

May God's wondrous blessings be with each of you this day and always. Tim
