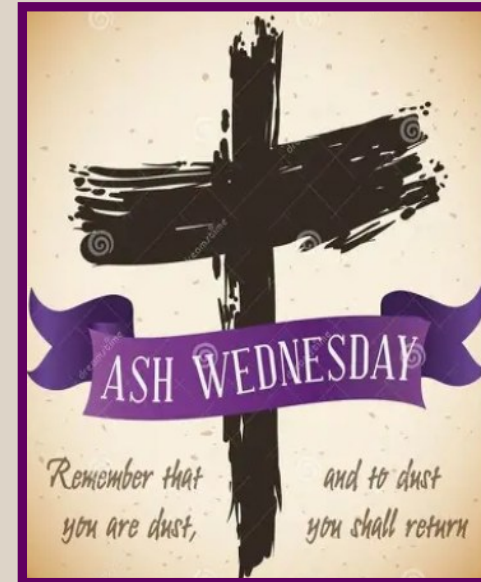

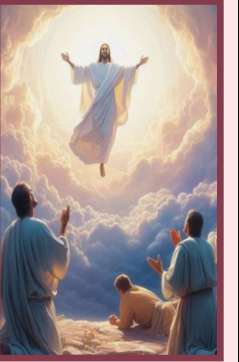


You are cordially invited to join us at **6:30 PM** on **Wednesday, February 18** as we celebrate **Ash Wednesday**. The visible ashes placed on the believer's forehead are a small way for Christians to honor the Jewish custom of wearing sackcloth and ashes as a symbol of mourning, repentance, the frailty and mortality of our humanity and our total dependence on God. Many people see the ashes as a beautiful witness and chance to open a conversation about Jesus. Ash Wednesday also marks the beginning of the Lenten Season. Lent references the time Jesus spent being tempted in the desert. Lent is meant to prepare the heart of believers of the solemn remembrance of the death of Jesus followed by the joyous and glorious Easter Sunday celebrating the Resurrection. Please make plans to join us for this very meaningful service.

JOEL 2:12-13 "Even now," declares the Lord, "return to me with all your heart, with fasting and weeping and mourning. Rend your heart and not your garments. Return to the Lord your God, for he is gracious and compassionate, slow to anger and abounding in love, and he relents from sending calamity."

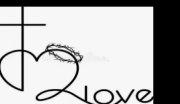
Transfiguration Sunday

Come and celebrate Transfiguration Sunday with us on **February 15** at **11:00 AM**. We will acknowledge the beautiful revelation of God in Jesus Christ and Christ's manifestation as the fulfillment of the law and of the prophets.



Transfiguration Sunday, a moment that is recognized as the bridge from the season of Epiphany to the journey into Lent. In the book of Exodus, Moses ascends the mountain into the cloud of God's glory, where he receives the word that will shape a people. In Psalm 99, the psalmist invites us to stand in awe of our Lord's majesty. In his second letter, Peter testifies that the story of Jesus' glory on the mountain is not a myth. It was a reality he saw with his own eyes — a lamp shining in a dark place. And in Matthew's Gospel (chapter 17), Jesus is described as transfigured, radiant and shining like the sun with a divine light. He is then affirmed by the Father's voice: "This is my Son, the Beloved ... listen to Him." These scriptures remind us that to encounter the glory and the magnificence of Christ. We are called to **shine with the light** that Jesus gives so others see Him through **us** and listen closely to the One who leads us into God's mission.

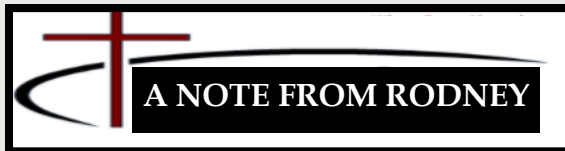

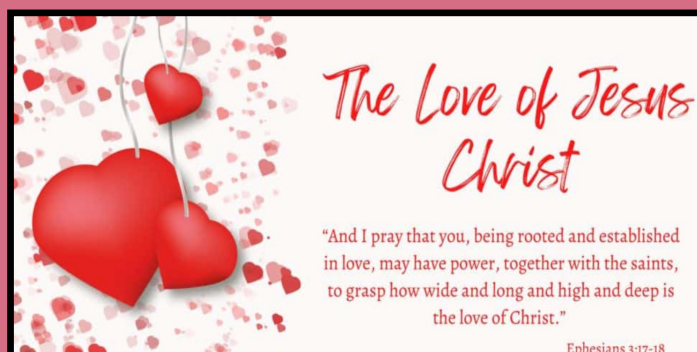

Notes from Tim

*Surely the presence of the Lord is in this place.
I can feel God's mighty power and His grace.
I can hear the brush of angel's wings,

The Chancel Choir sometimes begins our Service of Worship by singing as the Choral Call to Worship the words of this beautiful hymn. I would like to share the story and inspiration behind its composition.

Lanny Wolfe (born 1942) is an American Christian music songwriter and music publisher. Wolfe served for a number of years as the Dean of the School of Music at Jackson Bible School, Jackson College of Ministries in Jackson, Mississippi.

Wolfe's songs are included in a number of hymnals. "Surely the Presence of the Lord Is in This Place" is in most of today's hymnals, and is based on Jesus promise, "Where two or three are gathered together in my name, there I am in their midst" (Matthew 18:20).

It emphasizes the senses—feeling, hearing, touching, and seeing. We can feel the presence of the Lord—and hear the brush of the angel's wings—and see glory on each face.

Wolfe was inspired to write this song in 1977 when a friend invited The Lanny Wolfe Trio to sing at a dedication service for a new building. "Surely the Presence" is the song that the Trio sang for that occasion.

This song is especially important, because it helps us to get the emphasis right. We often talk about "the church on the corner," by which we mean a particular building. However, the building is not the church. The people are the church. The building is just the place where the church meets.

"Surely the presence" captures that nicely. The only reference to the building is the phrase "this place." The song shifts the focus to people, as in "each face" and "His children" and "two or three." It is a good reminder to all of us of the real meaning of "church."

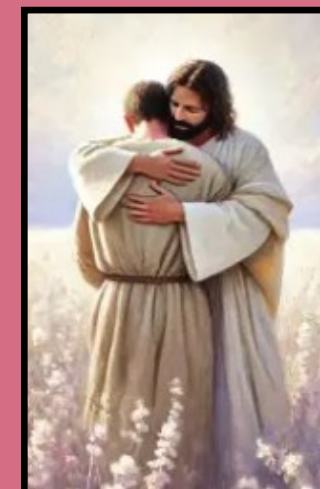
