

"Like newborn babies, crave pure spiritual milk, so that by it you may grow up in your salvation, now that you have tasted that the LORD is good." - 1 Peter 2:2-3

Peter uses the metaphor of "newborn infants" to illustrate the believers' need for spiritual nourishment. Christians should "long for the pure spiritual milk" just as a baby craves milk for growth and sustenance. This verse emphasizes the importance of desiring and consuming the Word of God for our development and our maturity in our faith.

Peter continues by stating that this longing should be driven by the taste of the Lord's goodness. The phrase "if indeed you have tasted that the Lord is good" hints at an experiential knowledge of God's grace and kindness. It suggests that once someone has experienced the goodness of God, their natural response should be a deeper craving for His Word.

When we actively seek out and consume spiritual teachings, wisdom, and experiences, we are nurturing our inner selves and paving the way for our spiritual development. Spiritual growth requires intentional effort coupled with a deep desire for God's truth. May we all immerse ourselves in His Word in the year 2026 as we experience His goodness and as we grow stronger in our faith.

Notes from Tim

Hymn Story - O Christians, Haste

A perfect hymn to sing during the Epiphany Season is "O Christians, Haste." This beautiful hymn was composed by Mary Ann Thomson. She was born in London, England on December 5, 1834 and wrote this hymn text in December 1868. She says, "I had written many hymns before, and one night, while I was sitting up with one of my children who was ill of typhoid fever, I thought I should like to write a missionary hymn to be used after the Christmas season to proclaim Christ's birth to all the world; and each verse would encourage Christians to fulfill their mission by sending sons and daughters to spread the message to every people and nation that God is love and light, and wants none to perish without hearing of the Savior. It urges giving of wealth and soul through prayer to speed the messengers on their way and publish the glad tidings of Jesus, His redemption, and release."

*O Christians, haste, thy mission high fulfilling,
to tell to all the world that God is Light;
that He who made all nations is not willing
one soul should perish, lost in shades of night.*

Refrain:

*Publish glad tidings, tidings of peace;
tidings of Jesus, redemption, and release.*

*Proclaim to every people, tongue, and nation
that God, in whom they live and move, is love;
tell how He stooped to save His lost creation,
and died on earth that we might live above.
[Refrain]*

*Give of your sons to bear the message glorious;
give of your daughters, speed them on their way;
Pour out your soul for them in prayer victorious;
Till God shall bring a new and brighter day.
[Refrain]*

On Sunday, January 4, we will celebrate Epiphany Sunday at the 11:00 worship service. Please come and join us as we together sing this wonderful hymn and share the message of God's love and everlasting light!
